

# **Eligibility Requirements**

- U.S. or Naturalized Citizen
- > 17 years old by September 1<sup>st</sup> of Freshman Year
- No older than 23 years old by December 31<sup>st</sup> for the year applying
- Physically qualified by Navy standards
  - Apply and be accepted to NROTC host schools

SAT/ACT Minimum Scores: /SAT: 530 Verbal a. 520 Math /ACT: 22 English a. 21 Math







Take Your SAT/ACT as often as possible. Don't wait until it is too late to take your SAT/ACT. The sooner you get competitive SAT/ACT scores, the more screenings you get at selection boards.

> Upon receipt of scholarship, you will be directed to take Department of Defense medical physical examination

You have until the first day of your second year of college to turn down the scholarship without owing the Navy





## College Program

- Non-subsidized NROTC program available to students entering college as a freshman
- Students are provided with all required uniforms and Naval Science textbooks
- Student may be a member of the College Program at an NROTC unit
- College Program MIDN, with less that 30 college credit hours, are eligible to apply to national board

### DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE COLLEGE PROGRAMS Ninority Serving Institution Scholarship Reservation (MSISR)

- Identical to the National NROTC scholarship except that it is only available to students who plan to attend select Historically Black Colleges or Universities (HBCU), High Hispanic Enrollment (HHE) Universities or Minority Serving Institutions (MSI) with a Naval ROTC Program
- Visit the NROTC website for a full list of participating Colleges/Universities





# **MSISR (continued)**

- Recommend applying for BOTH National and MSISR Scholarships
- Only available for Navy option
- Eligibility Requirements
  - If in College, 2.75 GPA and a grade of "C" or better in all courses attempted
  - SAT or ACT
    - SAT: Math (500) & Critical Reading (500)
    - ACT: Math (21) & English (20)
  - GPA of at least 3.0 in high school

Military Tuition Assistance is A contracted to eligible members of the Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, and Coast Guard. Congress has given each service the ability to pay up to 100% for the tuition expenses of its members.

Each service has its own criteria for eligibility, obligated service, application process' and restrictions. This money is usually paid directly to the institution by the individual services

# MILITARY TRAINING

The American Council on Education collaborates with the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) to review military training and experiences and recommend appropriate college credit for members of the Armed Forces.





ACE provides quality assurance and policy guidance for the Joint Services Transcript (JST) used by the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, and Coast Guard. More than 2,300 colleges and universities recognize these transcripts as official documentation of military training and experiences and applicable ACE credit recommendations.





# POST 9/11 GI BILL

The Post-9/11 GI Bill provides education benefits for servicemembers who have served on active duty for 90 or more days since Sept. 10, 2001. The Post-9/11 GI Bill can pay your full tuition & fees at school, provide you with a monthly housing allowance while you are going to school, and give you up to \$1,000 a year to use for books and supplies.

If you live in the middle of nowhere the Post-9/11 GI Bill will even provide you with a one-time relocation allowance to move to where your school is located. Another provision of the Post-9/11 GI Bill allows eligible servicemembers to transfer their unused benefits to family members.

You can use your Post-9/11 GI Bill for college and many other types of training.
